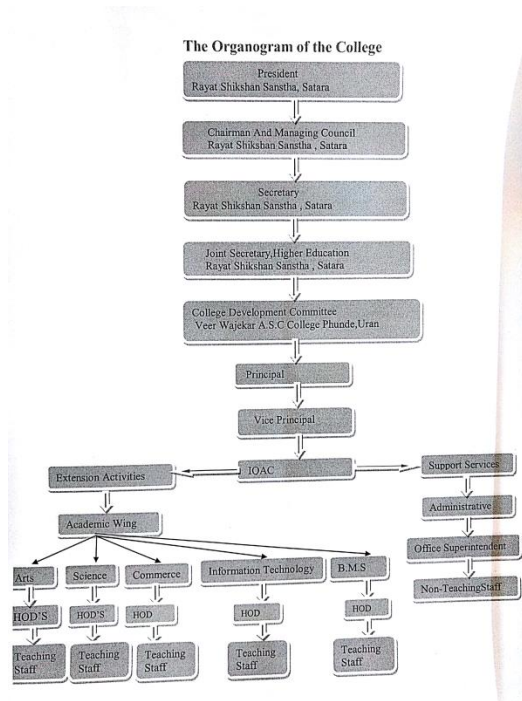

- **Waste Management**
- **Solid waste management:**
The college practices initiatives like 3R- Reduce, Reuse and recycle to maintain cleanliness and eco-balance. The tress on paperless office and consistent effort to reduce plastic on campus preserve the campus as

plastic free zone. Zero flex policy imposes restriction on use of flex boards in campus.

Separate bins for collection of dry and wet waste are kept at prominent places in the campus. The organic waste materials are used in vermin-compost and the manure obtained is used for maintenance of the green cover of campus. The plastic and paper waste is sold to scrap dealers.

Liquid waste management:

Extremely hazardous chemicals like di-chloro methane, acetic anhydride, etc are not used in laboratories. The waste is drain after proper treatment and attempt is made to dilute the liquid waste while draining.

e-waste management:

Electronic goods are put to optimum use and life of the electronic items is extended by proper upgrading and maintenance. The periodic checking of non-working or old electronic equipment is filter out and disposed-off properly.

Non-working laboratory equipment computers monitor's printers and batteries are sold as scrap material on systematic basis in order to insure their safe recycling. The useful parts are kept aside for future use.

- **Rain Water harvesting –**

College has taken initiative in conservation of water by implementing various activities and programs –

Regarding rainwater harvesting, college have under taken following steps

1. Rain water accumulating in college campus is drained out into excavation done all around the campus boundary which serves as a holding pond for rainwater and percolation towards ground water.

2. College in its limitation has prepared underground water tank for sorting rainwater of 25,000/- liters at one end of college ground, this water is used for watering plants and cleaning purpose.

3. Slopes are maintained on building roof so as to collect all the rainwater in college campus so as to enable maximum percolation.

4. Our College ground has kata fencing on all sides so as to retain maximum rain water in the campus facilitating percolation to ground water.

5. Rain water is harvested and stored by department of Chemistry and Zoology for its use as distil water in Laboratories.

- **Use of public transport:**

- We motivate student to use public transport. 90% of our students are using public transport. Rest of the students using private vehicles have been awarded regarding environment conservation & which have

initiated sharing private vehicle or carpooling. The teachers are also adopted car-polling system favouring low carbon emission.

- **Pedestrian Friendly roads:**

- Vehicles are not permissible in the near vicinity of the college making roads pedestrian friendly. Separate parking facilities are allotted for various types of vehicles. To keep this fact in mind students and stakeholders are not allowed to park their vehicles on the road leading to the college. The roads leading to college is broad.

- **Initiatives for minimizing the use of paper:**

Boards are used to write and display important information to students and staff.

The notices are announced through the speaker.

Our Administration is efficiently moving towards paperless functioning. Many of our notices instruction, guidelines to the student regarding exams, scholarship, and various activities are communicated through Public address system. Some of our activities are mailed directly on email ID of concerned faculty especially all activities of IQAC. The notices and activities are also shared by WhatsApp groups and other social media sources.

- **Efforts for plastic free campus:**

Along the college campus, we have well maintained pedestrian friendly roads. College has conducted continuous awareness among students to ban plastics. At present none of our students use plastic bags. This ban of plastic use is also spreading in nearby village.

- **Green Landscaping:**

All along the fencing of ground nearly 110 trees are planted which includes bottle palm, Coconut Neem, Bakul, Karanj, Gulmohar and various flowering plants like Shankasur, Musanda, Keshar Fistula etc. along with 30 tree pots along the sides of building giving a scenic beauty to the campus creates very fresh eco-friendly atmosphere.
